The U.S. Grains Council will be holding its 22nd International Marketing Conference and the 65th Annual Membership Meeting in Austin, Texas at the Renaissance Austin Hotel. The Renaissance Austin Hotel is conveniently situated in the heart of Texas's state capital. Strategically located just minutes from the Austin Arboretum, The Domain and downtown, guests have the opportunity to explore the best of the area.

Hotel reservations

The reservations deadline is Monday, January 13, 2025. After this date, the hotel will accept reservations on a space-available basis. The Council has negotiated a room rate of \$259 USD per night, single or double occupancy, plus a 17.82 percent tax. Check-in time is 4 p.m.; check-out time is 11 a.m.



Ground Transportation

Renaissance Austin Hotel is located approximately 18 miles from Austin-Bergstrom International Airport (airport code: AUS). Contact the Concierge for assistance with reservations for a taxi or other ride sharing options.

Transportation to the hotel via taxi will cost approximately \$45 one-way. Uber or Lyft are available at an estimated cost of \$40-\$45 one-way.
